

**GUIDELINE

(JANUARY 1st, 2021 TO JUNE 30th, 2021)**

1.0 GOAL

- 1.1 The guidelines are intended to inform on application procedures of students' activities, Universiti Tun Hussein Onn Malaysia (UTHM) Phase 1/2021.
- 1.2 The guidelines are applied to all international students' activities organized by clubs and associations which are officially registered with the University.
- 1.3 These guidelines are effective from January 1st, 2021 to June 30th, 2021 for students who are staying in residential colleges or off campus.

2.0 APPLICATION FOR STUDENTS' ACTIVITIES

- 2.1 Referring to New Normal Management of Students' Affair in lieu of students' stages reentry to campus (***Garis Panduan Pengurusan Hal Ehwal Pelajar Dalam Kebiasaan Baharu Lanjutan Kemasukan Semula Pelajar ke Kampus Universiti Secara Berperingkat***) dated July 25th 2020, the following is General Procedure of Students' Activities Implementation (***Tatacara Umum Pelaksanaan Aktiviti Pelajar***), if conducted face-to-face:
 - a) Symptomatic students are not allowed to attend activities.
 - b) All participants must practice physical distancing throughout the activities.
 - c) Any activities which involve body contact are not allowed.
 - d) All participants are encouraged to wear masks subject to the types of activities carried out.
 - e) Organizers are responsible for providing hand sanitizer, recording attendance and performing disinfections at venues upon completion of activities.
 - f) All participants must use the designated entry and exit points of the location.
 - g) The food should be packed for takeaways.

- h) The number of students allowed to be involved at any one time is subject to location size with the implementation of physical distancing practices.
 - i) Generally, online activities are highly recommended, except for activities that requires a face-to-face meeting.
- 2.2 The organizer of the activity is solely responsible for monitoring and ensuring Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) compliance throughout the course of the activity.
- 2.3 The permitted provisions are subject to the rates approved in the Bursar's Circular No.14/2008 Financial Guidelines for Implementation of Student Programs/Activities or related circulars in force.

3.0 SOURCES OF PROVISION

- 3.1 The source of funding for the implementation of students' activities is *Tabung Pejabat Antarabangsa* (E15245) or any provision approved by the University for 2021.
- 3.2 The procurement process for the implementation of students' activities is subject to the rules and regulation or circulars in force. Any violation of the University procurement procedures is NOT ALLOWED.

4.0 LIMITATION

- 4.1 The implementation of student activities, either online or face-to-face (physical) are subject to the following:
- a) Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) established by the National Security Council (MKN) or Ministry of Health Malaysia (MOH) or the University.
 - b) Related Movement Control Order (MCO) as enforced by the Malaysian Government.
 - c) New regulations or guidelines issued by the Government or University from time to time.

5.0 CORE ACTIVITIES MATCHING TARGET

5.2 To support the University's aspiration to raise awareness on the importance of maintaining campus sustainability, the activities carried out should take into account/include elements of campus sustainability.

- b) Increasing sustainability activities and creating a Green Campus atmosphere.
- c) Increasing savings and reducing environmental pollution.

5.4 Among the recommendations for sustainability activities that can be applied, subject to suitability, is:

- a) Participants are required to bring their own water bottles.
- b) Activities are promoted using e-poster, e-banner, or e-brochure with minimal printouts.
- c) Communal work (*gotong royong*) after activities by separating recyclable materials.

- d) Implement the concept of 3R (Reduce, Reuse and Recycle) in the program.
- e) Plastic-free food packaging.
- f) Bring their own food container.
- g) Planting trees/ plants.
- h) Digital entrepreneurs.
- i) Implement sustainability campaigns such as energy and water conservation campaigns.
- j) Environmentally related activities (hiking, plugging, tagging, trees, etc.)

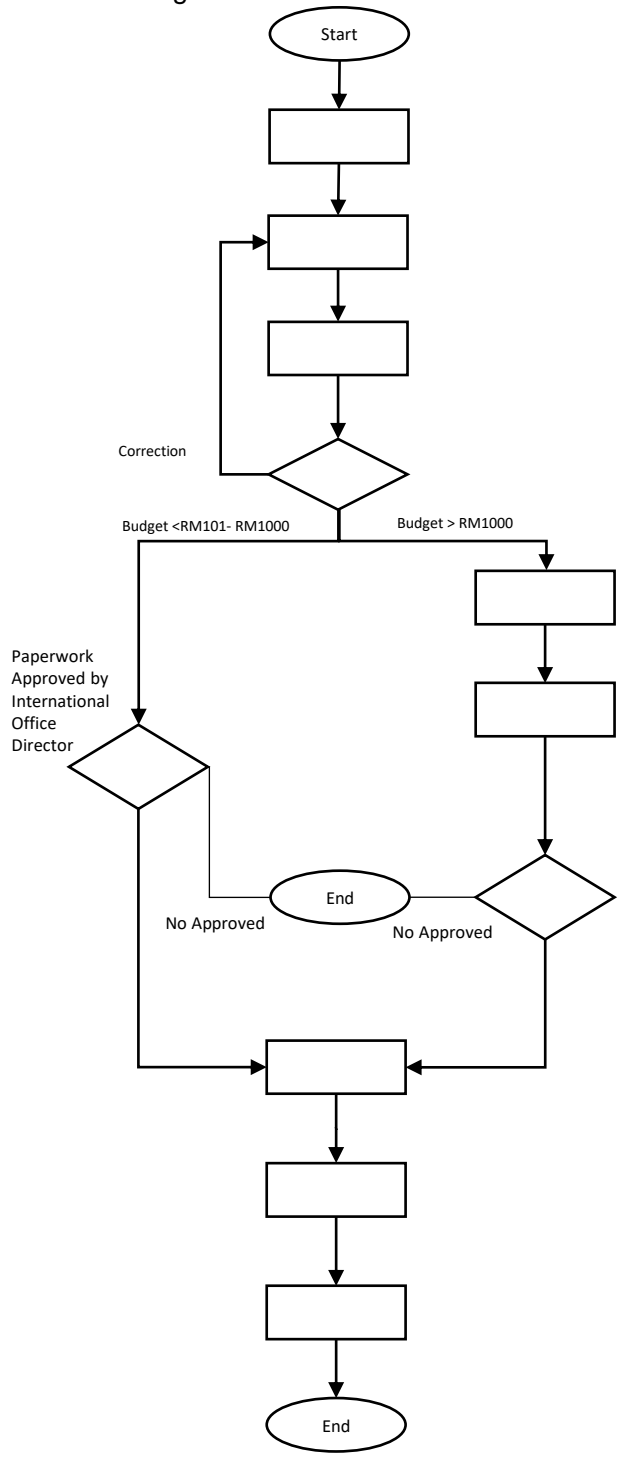

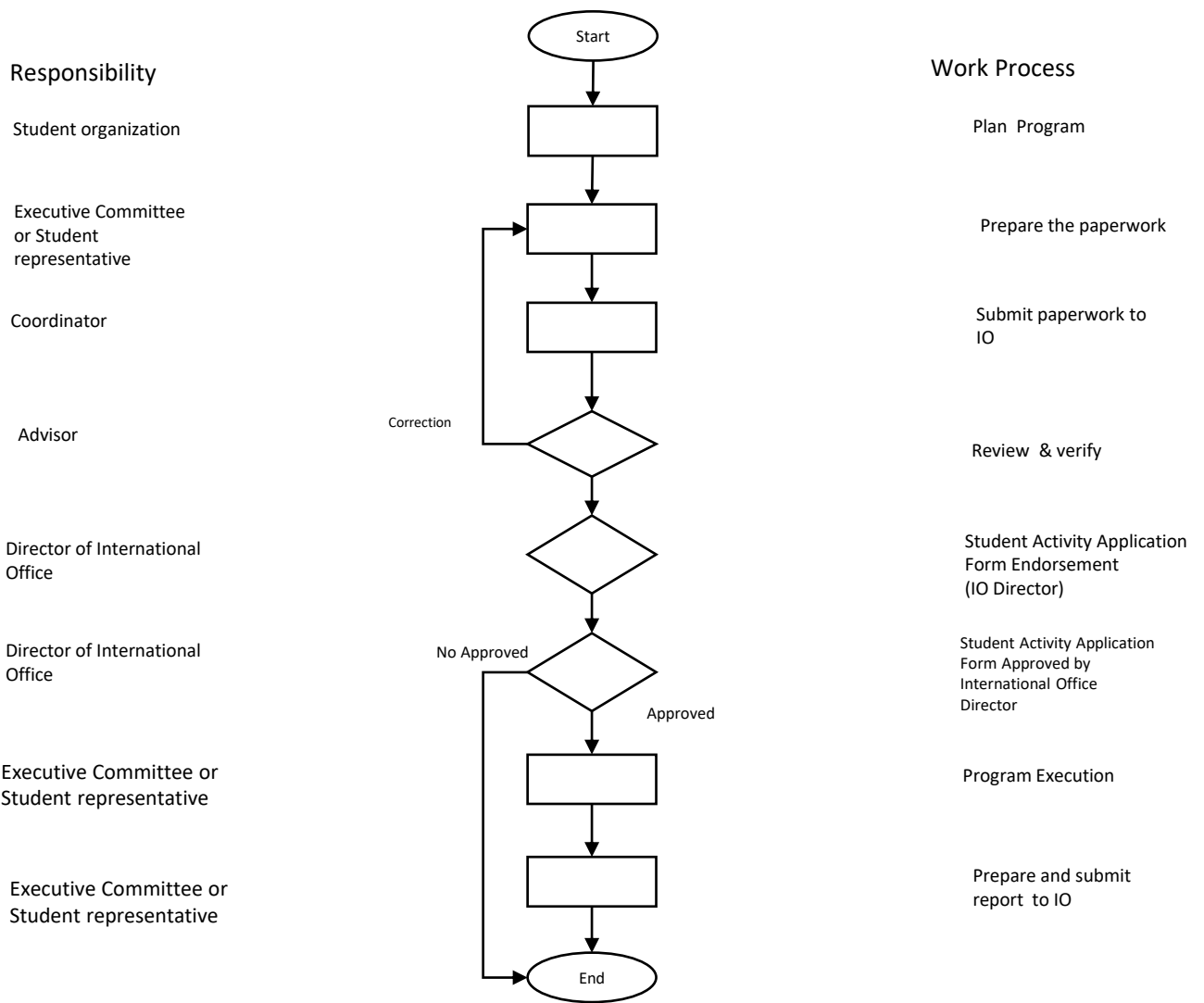


